INTRODUCING PEAKSHIFT: COMMUNITY-OPTIMIZED ENERGY PRICING

OUC—The *Reliable* One is modernizing its electric service pricing with PeakSHIFT, a multiyear plan designed to make energy costs more equitable and encourage smarter energy use. Approved unanimously in December 2024 by OUC's Board of Commissioners, PeakSHIFT ensures we continue to prioritize reliability, affordability, sustainability, and resiliency while adapting to our community's evolving energy needs.

To ensure customers understand these opportunities, OUC will spend the next 24 months educating the community about PeakSHIFT. Neighborhood meetings in 2025 and 2026 will offer energy conservation tips and direct access to OUC representatives who can discuss upcoming changes.

PeakSHIFT includes four programs that will be rolled out gradually over the next several years. These include a relaunched, optional SunChoice **Solar** subscription program to expand community solar access, updated **TruNet Solar** compensation

for new rooftop solar customers effective July 1, 2025, **DemandLevel Pricing** to better align grid costs with usage, and the introduction of Shift & Save, an industry-proven time-of-day pricing plan that rewards customers for shifting electricity use to off-peak hours.

Together, these programs provide opportunities for customers to take better control of their energy bills while optimizing the grid for long-term affordability.

Prepare Now for Cold Weather

Florida's winter weather is here! OUC offers tips to keep your family safe

SPACE HEATER SAFETY

- Check Heaters: Inspect for frayed cords or loose connections. Don't use damaged units.
- Three-Foot Rule: Keep heaters three feet away from flammable items.
- Flat Surfaces Only: Avoid furniture or rugs to prevent fire risks.
- Unplug When Not in Use: Always turn off and unplug space heaters and electric blankets.
- No Extension Cords: Plug heaters directly into wall outlets.



- Open chimney flues before use.
- Use safety screens. Never leave fires unattended.

CANDLE SAFETY

- Place candles in sturdy holders.
- Keep away from flammable items and children.

SMOKE DETECTORS

• Check and replace batteries regularly.

PROTECT WATER RESOURCES

 Allow a trickle of water to run through exposed pipes and keep pool pumps running.

Daylight Saving Time Checklist

As clocks "spring forward" on March 9, be sure to follow this twice-a-year household safety checklist. Check or replace:

- Batteries in smoke and carbon monoxide detectors
- Expired items in your first aid kit
- Hurricane/emergency kit items
- Fire extinguisher pressure and expiration date
- Burned out or dimming exterior light bulbs
- Flashlight and weather alert radio batteries

Adjust Irrigation Settings

When clocks move up an hour this spring, so too do the St. Johns River Water Management District's irrigation rules. Below are the days you're allowed to water your yard beginning with daylight saving time:

- Saturday & Wednesday: Homes with odd-numbered or no addresses
- Thursday & Sunday: Homes with even-numbered addresses
- Tuesday & Friday: Non-residential (commercial, public, industrial) properties

Remember to water only when necessary for no more than one hour per zone and never between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. Learn more about watering restrictions at **SJRWMD.org**.
