Number of Days 31

Rainfall and temperature readings are recorded by the National Weather Service (NWS) at Orlando International Airport (MCO). Monthly normal degree days are the medium values for the 30 year period ending 12/31/2013. Departure is an amount above or below normal. A DEGREE-DAY is the difference between a particular day's mean (average of maximum and minimum) temperature and a base temperature of 65 deg. F. One COOLING DEGREE-DAY (CDD) is counted for each degree higher than this base, and one HEATING DEGREE-DAY (HDD) is counted for each degree lower. Normal weather values reflect the entire month.
